We live in a world filled with little white lies. It reminds me of last month, April—home to one of our favorite days of the year: Tax Day! Ever wonder how many small untruths are told on tax returns? Or how many job candidates will get interviewed today after stretching the truth on their resumes?

The thing about small lies is, they tend to grow. Given enough time, they can turn into something much bigger. At the heart of it, Christian, this all comes down to faithfulness and stewardship. Will you choose to be faithful and a good steward—even in the smallest, most seemingly insignificant situations? That's who we are called to be.

I've been preaching through the book of Daniel recently, and it's been a joy to reflect on the powerful examples of faithfulness found in its pages. Daniel stood firm, even in the little things. Living in exile in a foreign land, he was offered the opportunity to be trained in the ways of that culture—and even to eat the best food. But Daniel faced a dilemma: that food had been sacrificed to idols and eating it would defile his commitment to God. In the grand scheme of life, that might seem like a small issue—but Daniel chose to put his relationship with God first.

It makes me wonder if God was using that small decision to prepare Daniel's faith for the much bigger challenges ahead. Over time, Daniel would continue to stay faithful—even when it meant risking his life. How else could he stand before powerful kings and deliver hard truths—truths that foretold their downfall? Can you imagine how difficult that must have been? There's so much we can learn from Daniel's example of unwavering faithfulness.

Maybe God is withholding greater responsibilities from your life because you're still wrestling with the small ones. Be faithful in the little things first!

This past month, in FBC Kids, we have been focusing on the Easter story: from the celebration of Palm Sunday, to the Last Supper with the disciples, to Jesus' death on the cross, the joy of His resurrection on Easter morning, and finally, when Jesus appeared to His disciples after rising from the dead. Each Sunday, we opened the Bible and explored these powerful biblical truths.

One Sunday, during our lesson on the resurrection, a second grader asked, "If Jesus is alive again, does that mean He's still walking around?" Before I could answer, another child said, "No, He's in heaven—but He is still with us!" What followed was a thoughtful



discussion about prayer, heaven, and how Jesus is with us even if we can't see Him. This moment reminded me how much kids really listen, process, and engage with truth—even at such a young age.

Easter reminds us that Jesus willingly gave His life for us, rose again, and now offers us a relationship with Him. One of the many things I love about children's ministry is that it is a place where seeds are planted, big questions lead to truth, and the next generation is being shaped by the gospel. Jesus changes their lives.

Please continue to pray for the children at FBC—that their faith will grow strong and their questions will lead them to a deeper love for Jesus. Pray also for our leaders, who pour their time, energy, and love into this ministry each week.

I am honored to teach the kids each week and watch them learn to follow Jesus. Thank you for supporting FBC Kids. I am grateful to be part of a church that values children's spiritual growth.
