I am excited to begin our new sermon series in First Corinthians. After spending much of this year in the book of Daniel, I sensed the Lord leading me to turn our attention back to the New Testament. Paul, who authored most of the New Testament letters, often wrote to churches facing unique challenges. The church in Corinth was no exception.

Corinth was a cultural crossroads in the ancient world, a center of commerce, arts, and philosophy. This diversity also brought many competing worldviews and a host of worldly influences into the life of the church. Paul addressed these

issues directly, helping believers understand how to live in a way that honored Christ in the midst of cultural pressures.

Although our circumstances today are not identical to Corinth's, we too face the constant challenge of worldly influences creeping into our churches and into our own lives. On a personal level, each of us has struggles with sin that God continues to refine.

As we walk through this series together, I encourage you not to simply listen with others in mind, thinking how a message might apply to a friend or family member, but instead to ask, "What is God saying to me?" My prayer is that each of us will be open to God's correction, encouragement, and refining work, so that we may grow to be more like Christ.

It is a privilege to serve as your pastor, and I look forward to what God will do in and through us as we study First Corinthians together. I welcome your feedback and invite you to join me with an open heart as we seek Christ's transforming work in our lives.

College & Career Sunday School - August

Two months ago, I took a leap of faith and began teaching the College & Career Young Adults Sunday School class. To be honest, I thought I'd be the one doing the teaching—but I've quickly learned they are teaching me just as much.

I don't have a Bible degree or years of ministry training, but I'm reminded of the Samaritan Woman in John 4:1–42. She wasn't a Pharisee, a disciple, or a religious leader. Her past was messy, and she was even considered an outcast in her own community. Yet, after meeting Jesus, she left her water jar behind and ran to tell others, "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?" Scripture tells us, "Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony" (John 4:39).

Like her, I don't come with titles or degrees—but I do come with faith in Jesus, and that is enough to serve Him in this ministry.

This month has been bittersweet. Several of our young adults have left San Angelo to begin a new semester in other cities. While their absence is temporary, I will deeply miss their insights, conversations, and encouragement. At the same time, I look forward with hope—trusting God will bring new students to join our small but faithful group.

Last Sunday, I participated in First Sunday at Angelo State University and the Baptist Student Ministry. I had no idea what I was doing, but with a little faith (and a lot of gift bags), I set up a table to invite students to church. I prepared 30 bags filled with school supplies, treats, and included a QR code with directions to First Baptist Church. Over 25 students stopped by, eager to learn more about our church family. What a joy it was to connect with them!

As August comes to a close, I am praying for our current Sunday School members and for the many ASU students I met—that they would feel welcomed, find community, and most importantly, grow in their walk with Jesus. My own story is not without its messiness, but just as Christ met the Samaritan Woman where she was, He has met me where I am. That alone is testimony enough, and it's worth sharing.

FBC KIDS

Trusting God in Every Season: Lessons from Gideon, Ruth, and Samuel

This past month in FBC Kids, we explored stories of ordinary people who trusted God in extraordinary ways. We began with Gideon (Judges 6–7), learning that God helps me grow stronger. The kids were amazed that God used just 300 soldiers to defeat an enormous army. One child asked, "Why would God pick a smaller group instead of a bigger one?" That led to a great conversation about how God doesn't need big numbers or strong people—He wants us to trust Him. It reminded us that God's strength is greater than our own.



Next, we turned to Ruth and Naomi (Ruth 1–4), discovering that God brings hope during hard times. The kids noticed how Ruth chose to stay with Naomi even when life was difficult. One little girl said, "It's nice that Ruth didn't leave Naomi." What a sweet reminder that God often uses people to bring us comfort and hope. We also studied the birth of Samuel (1 Samuel 1), where we learned that God answers our prayers. Hannah's deep prayers touched the kids, and one child wondered, "Does God always hear me, even if I don't get what I ask for?" That question started a meaningful discussion about how God always hears us, but He answers in the way that is best for His plan.

The next lesson was about God calling Samuel in the night (1 Samuel 3), teaching us that God tells us what is true. The children loved the idea that Samuel heard God's actual voice, and they connected it to how we hear God's truth today through His Word, the Bible.

One question that stuck with me during our lesson was, "What if God calls me, but I don't know it's Him? What if I miss it?" This question opened the door for us to talk about how God speaks to us, and we need to be listening and willing servants (1 Samuel 3:10). I love watching the kids and their desire to know how to recognize God's voice and how we should respond to Him.

Each week, I am encouraged by how deeply our kids think about God's Word. They don't just hear the stories, they ask big questions, and want to apply them to their own lives. These kids are learning to see God's faithfulness, to trust Him in every season, and to believe that He can use them, too. Please continue to pray for the children of FBC—that they will grow in strength like Gideon, hold onto hope like Ruth and Naomi, pray like Hannah, and listen like Samuel. Pray also for our faithful leaders who guide and encourage them each week.

It is such a joy to walk alongside this generation as they discover that God is real, powerful, and personal—and that He has a plan for their lives.

FBC MUSIC



Technological Obsolescence or: Teaching an Old Dog New Tricks.

Around 20 years ago, I bought a piece of software for music notation called Finale. Finale was cutting-edge, it was the standard. It would allow a user to create notes on a page for others to play, to hear their compositions, and to tweak in what seemed like limitless ways. It was robust and functioned very well for music composers, arrangers, students, and hobbyists. The first time I was able to connect a MIDI keyboard to my computer and watch the notes I pecked out become written music on the screen was, frankly, incredible.

Over the years, I have used Finale for coursework, for idle ideas, for arranging pop tunes so a basketball band could play them, and for composing string parts to a new worship song a friend had written. Every computer that I have owned for the last 20 years has Finale installed, including the one currently in my office. On August 26 of 2024, it was announced that Finale would no longer be developed or supported. Users were given one year of support and encouraged to move on to the next big thing. And so, I did. I installed Dorico 5 on my work computer and was immediately frustrated when it didn't work exactly the way I knew Finale to.

Many of you will have had a similar experience, I'm sure. Whether it's learning how to set a new watch or programming the automatic coffee maker to be ready when you're ready for it to be ready; we all encounter learning curves when something new comes our way. These frustrations can really test our sanctification at times. As the saying goes, after all, "you can't teach an old dog new tricks."

Using the new Dorico software when working on small projects over the last several months has been an interesting experience. I have gradually found my comfort level with the new software and my time-per-task has rapidly improved. Finding our way in the unknown is frequently daunting and can also be incredibly rewarding. I want to encourage you to take on your new tasks with a mindset of excitement, not dread.

When we are put into a new situation, when the Lord is giving us new opportunities to share and proclaim, let's not get bogged down with how things aren't how they used to be. The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob is the same yesterday, today, and forevermore; and yet, He still says in verses like Isaiah 43:19 that He can and will do "new things." Let's be ready with a willing heart for God's new thing!
